Welcome, Wumindjika and G'day

Anyone have a feeling of déjà vu? All local HCCC & Victorian TGN readers will know what I mean as we're back in lockdown - again, but it's only for 7 days and we're all becoming quite expert at adaptation.

A lockdown is announced and one goes into automatic pilot mode. Even though essential shopping is exempt, there is always a quick mental calculation of how much food is at home—especially cans of dog food! In my day job, there is the notification to the volunteer staff that their services are not required until next Friday, signs attached to the front door advising closure for 7 days and the phone message changed to reflect the current circumstances. Then it's back to working from home! It's annoying, but not alarming - we've done it before and we know that aside from a fully vaccinated population that masks, lockdowns and quarantine are the best ways to ensure that this insidious virus doesn't get the upper hand.

What is concerning though are the following facts and the lack of progress to rectify some of them

- The Covid-19 virus is global, highly infectious and like all viruses it is able to morph and mutate
- The virus is spread in many ways, but for some time now aerosol droplet dispersal has been accepted as one of them
- There have been 17 outbreaks, in 5 states, of virus spread from hotel guarantine over the last few months
- Several states, Victoria included, have put forward plans for purpose-built quarantine facilities (like Howard Springs) for the more high-risk/positive quarantine cases, yet so far none of these plans have been given the green light
- The roll-out of vaccines, across the country, is way behind any original planes due to a multitude of reasons including mixed messages across the media
- Although there is concern re blood clotting with the Astra Zeneca vaccine in the under 50s, medical experts have advised that there is a 1:88,000 chance of this happening. One has a greater chance of winning Tattslotto Division 3 (5 winning numbers) 1:36,689
- Another Victorian lockdown has meant that both Covid tests and vaccinations have set new records over the last couple of days
- Within hours of the latest lockdown being announced the Federal Government released an extra 100,000 vaccine doses for Victorians which hopefully might finish vaccinating the old and the disabled.
- My local doctor is only allocated 50 vaccine doses a week, but even
 if more were made available there is not enough extra staff or space
 to administer them, which means that, although I booked in 3
 weeks ago for a vaccination, my appointment is not until 8th July!

Apologies for going on at length about this but every life is precious and we CAN beat this mongrel virus. See p. 3 for a list of vaccination locations. Until the next issue of TGN, stay safe and warm, **Pauline**And Kenny... was back on his favourite fire truck publicising Mudbash.



RECYCLING QUIZ

As promised here are the answers to last week's quiz.

1. Are McDonalds' cups recyclable?

No. The cups are made from liquid paper with a low amount of plastic in the cup. It's not worth the time to re-process at the moment.

2. Are milk cartons recyclable?

Not at the moment as they're made from liquid paper, but this may change in the future so keep putting them in the recycle bin. They are currently sorted and then used as thermal mass to offset fossil fuels.

3. Can batteries be put into your recycling bin?

No, as they can start fires in the truck or processing facility. They can be recycled by dropping off at council disposal depots of at Officeworks.

4. Which item is the hardest to separate out in the recycling process?

Paper bags.

5. Can shredded paper be recycled?

No, it ends up as paper dust and damages the machinery. Put it in your compost bin and consider using a black marker to cross out any important details instead of shredding the paper.

6. Can heat-activated receipts be recycled? (These receipts are the ones that turn black when left in the sun.)

No, it contaminates the paper being sorted.

7. Should you crush aluminium cans before putting them into the recycle bin?

No, the machines are designed for the standard aluminium can shape and size.

8. Should you do anything special with aluminium foil or trays before putting them into the recycle bin?

Yes, roll it into a ball as then it doesn't resemble paper.

9. Can you recycle aluminium containers lined with paint or plastic?

Yes, the furnace will deal with it.

10. Can you recycle steel bottle tops?

Yes, consider putting them in a steel can and closing them in. More steel is used for bottle caps than cars. They're important to recycle.

11. Can you recycle pet food sachets?

No, metalicised plastics can't be recycled.

12. Can you put green waste into a recycling bin?

Absolutely not, it can lead to the whole collection in the truck being taken to landfill. Use your green bin or take any green waste to local council resource recovery centres.

REVIEW OF MAYORAL AND COUNCILLOR ALLOWANCES LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1989 AND 2020

In accordance with the requirements of the *Local Government Acts* 1989 *and* 2020 Council is required to review Mayoral and Councillor Allowances prior to 30 June 2021.

At its meeting of 18 May 2021, Council resolved to give notice that the review has commenced and is now seeking community input into the review.

Allowances are set by the Minister for Local Government and **Strathbogie Shire is a Category 1 municipality – Small Rural Council.**

At its May Council meeting, Council resolved in principle to retain allowances at their current levels, which are:

Mayoral allowance: \$62,884 allowance plus \$5,973.98 allowance equivalent to the superannuation guarantee of 9.5%

Councillor allowance: \$21,049 allowance plus \$1999.66 allowance equivalent to the superannuation guarantee of 9.5%.

Submissions from the community are now sought in accordance with section 223 of the *Local Government Act* 1989 in relation to this allowance review.

Goulburn Valley Regional Library Corporation, trading as Goulburn Valley Libraries provide Library services to the communities in the municipalities of City of Greater

Shepparton, Moira Shire and Strathbogie Shire. We operate ten Libraries in the townships of Cobram, Euroa, Mooroopna, Nagambie, Nathalia, Numurkah, Tatura, Violet Town, Yarrawonga and the City of Shepparton and a Mobile Library service that serves smaller communities within the region. A Central Administration centre at Shepparton supports the Library operations by providing shared support services and logistics.

The Corporation is established by an Agreement between the three member municipalities, approved by the Minister for Local Government in accordance with the *Local Government Act*.

- Monitor organisational performance.

The Board consists of nine members, three nominated from each member municipality, including:

- A Councillor,
- A Senior Officer
- A Community Representative

The Board is independent from the member Councils and must act in the interests of the Corporation.


