FREE Koala Habitat Trees from your Landcare Group

Hughes Creek Catchment Collaborative is offering free trees

to landholders in the Hughes Creek and Whiteheads Creek
Catchments again in 2021. We are lucky to have koala
populations in the Strathbogie Ranges and this initiative aims to support
the future of these populations by planting more feeding trees now. We
have manna gums, candlebarks, blue gums and swamp gums, all grown at
the Euroa arboretum from local seed. These will grow into big trees that
are not suitable for gardens, they would be great as wind breaks, shade
trees, paddock trees, along creeks as well as adding to remnant
vegetation. The tube stock trees come with free guards and stakes if you
need them. (recycle from previous plantings if possible) You can have
from 20 to 100 plants depending on how keen you are on restoring koala














HIGHLANDS RAMBLERS ARE BACK!


