With picnic lunches in backpacks we shared cars to the end of Blue Top Road where we were led through fields to the stunning and enormous National Bank Rocks.


Other highlights were the views from the top of Mount Helen with its trig marker and seeing one of the largest Banksia trees in the district.








Dead in the Water - Richard Beasley

This book's sub-title "A Very angry book about our greatest environmental catastrophe...the death of the Murray-Darling Basin" says it all really. Richard Beasley was Council Assisting Bret Walker QC, the Royal Commissioner for the Murray-Darling Basin Commission, instigated by the South Australian Government in 2018. As such he heard and examined a wealth of



information about the degradation and mismanagement of the most important river system in our country. He goes to great lengths to explain the machinations of the Murray-Darling Basin Authority and their lack of transparency, their cavalier attitude towards the legally binding Water Act 2007 and their total disregard for any scientifically verified facts that illustrate the devastating impact our current use, and abuse, of the water is having on the environment. It really is a VERY angry book. Some readers will find Beasley's idiosyncratic style of writing entertaining and humorous, others may find it offensive and inappropriate. All readers will find this book simultaneously depressing, illuminating and addictive. As the HCCC is a part of this massive and vitally important river system this should be an essential read for everyone. There will be copies at local libraries, reserve yours now!
