Letter to the Editor

Two years ago, the Granite News published several photos of the stressed red stringybark after the hot and dry summer and autumn of 2019.

These were on our property, on the northern slopes of Looking Glass, but also occurred across the Strathbogies including Wallaby Gully.

Some trees have recovered fully or coppiced from the base or trunk. However many are now totally dead.

Previous plantings of red box and long leaf box had survived these dry and hot conditions on northern and western rocky slopes with thin soils.

During the last two winters, we have interplanted areas of dead trees with red box and some long leaf box.

These species were previously not characteristic of this part of the Strathbogies.

Climate change is happening and considerations of local provenance and species, endemic to the locations, to my mind are less important in order to ensure the future resilience of the landscapes of the Strathbogies.





I also had some observations on koalas. When we moved to Highlands 30+ years ago there was always one or more koalas in the stand of manna gums near the house. Today we are lucky to see one every few months.

I remember back then a well known zoologist at the time, living in Strathbogie, suggested there may be a need for some culling or relocation from the Strathbogie Ranges as the population of koalas

was so great that this would cause stress on the remaining habitat trees.

Initially, I thought we were seeing fewer koalas because of the replanting of manna gums we had undertaken, enabling koalas to be more widely spread. However, I now think there has been a decline as I rarely see them in other trees or along the roadside.

Taungurung – Healing Country Environmental Talk

Healing Country – Introduction (Matt Shanks)

The Taungurung Land and Waters Council (TLaWC) is the legal entity representing the Taungurung nation.

TLaWC has negotiated with the State, and have delegated Statutory Functions for the protection of Cultural Heritage as the Registered Aboriginal Party, as well as a Recognition and Settlement Agreement that seeks to recognize and empower Taungurung nation to activate their rights on Country.

After 65,000 years of sovereignty the TLaWC seeks to lead by example, and progress the community's vision of healing and caring for Country.

By Healing Country and making it healthy and safe the following can also be achieved –

Healing people

Strengthening knowledge

Applying knowledge

Developing research programs, led by Taungurung, with their partners


Focusing on culturally significant species (which might not necessarily be endangered) but are important to Taungurung culture

Involving both private and public (State) landholders in this healing work.

Taungurung ancestors managed the land in accordance with the seasonal variations, progression of the constellations, the lifecycles of flora and the migration of fauna, birds and fish.

Taungurung clan members are able to assist the wider community by embedding traditional Taungurung knowledge and practices into contemporary water and land management and also by expanding the cultural fire practice for ongoing and future healing of Country.

Taungurung Flag



The Taungurung sovereign flag was designed by Taungurung elder Loraine Padgham and features The Seven Sisters (The Pleiades) constellation on an ochre coloured background – ochre being a common feature of Taungurung lands.

The black base is for the Taungurung people and the yellow line represents the topography of the Taungurung lands – mountains and rivers – as well as the wanderings and ascent of the Taungurung people.

This design was chosen in 2020 from 36 entries submitted for consideration & was the first Traditional

Owners' flag to be flown in the state of Victoria.

NB: This talk was given during NAIDOC Week 2021 at the Y Water Discovery Centre and its content is definitely worthy of a wider audience. Over the next few weeks I'm intending to feature the rest of the topics for readers to consider and enjoy.
