As featured on the front page of the last issue of TGN Jenny Webb, HCCC President, recently attended a Landcare event entitled 'Reconnecting Our Catchment'. Not only did she attend but was also invited to speak about what HCCC does and its plans for the future. Jenny's points are succinct, incisive and make for interesting reading.

WHAT WE DO - Over the years HCCC has tried to identify and address critical issues which affect our unique, natural environment and our local community.

FOCUS for the NEXT 2 YEARS -

- To engage a new cohort of enthusiastic and talented local residents and to develop a strong succession plan for the group. A new HCCC website will be a valuable communication tool and will keep all stakeholders involved.
- Our **Soil Carbon** and **Regenerative Farming** projects will serve to inform more sustainable agriculture in the area.
- Our Biodiversity project will identify and examine the degradation of selected sites, followed by remediation works and a field day to inform the local community.

If we couple the above aspirations & activities with the **Top 10 Responses** (rated Important and Extremely Important) on the survey, that was completed in 2018 by interested landholders, then it is also possible to see what has been achieved and/or acted upon in the last few years and realise the importance of the HCCC's environmental work in the local area

The Top 10 are **listed on p.5** and, of those 10 concerns, 5 of them — **highlighted in green** are currently being undertaken with the assistance of the local community—YOU! The remaining topics are in planning stages
