Following on from last week's plans for HCCC...

Facilitator's Report from AGM - Neil van Buuren

After 2 years of covid impacted activity things started to get back to normal over the last 6 months. Here are the HCCC's planned projects for the next year.



Bio Security Project

Phase 1

Engage with the community through Landcare meeting & the local newsletter, the Granite News, to announce the details of the project. This will be done in conjunction with a survey to help identify areas of concern. The focus is around creeks, rivers and bogs where pest animals and weeds have degraded the land and increased the risks of water contamination.

Phase 2

Select 3-6 sites that will be the demonstration sites. The selection will involve meeting with landowners & getting a commitment for on going work to improve the land.

Phase 3

Measuring the true extent of the problem, this will involve aerial photos, videos of the site using drones and wildlife cameras.

Identification of weeds

A workshop with the community to announce the findings.

Phase 4

On-ground works clearing weeds, fencing,

Field day at the conclusion of work

Total project time = 46 weeks >>p.3

Post Covid - Post Carbon

Did you know?

By the last decade of the 19thC scientists were very confident that carbon dioxide was responsible for setting the temperature of Earth's atmosphere. In 1894 Swedish geologist Arvid Hogbom was able to explain the Carbon Cycle (basically how carbon atoms move around in the biosphere—see p.5 for diagram) This meant in 1896 his colleague, Svante Arrhenius, after doing 10s of 1000s of calculations concluded that human activity was definitely warming the Earth. In 1906 he fine tuned his work predicting "Any doubling of the percentage of carbon dioxide in the air...cont. p.5



HCCC Facilitator's Report... cont. from p.1 Regen Ag Project

Stage 1 - community engagement, agro ecologist to transfer knowledge, on the benefits of regeneration of soils

Stage 2 - selection of demonstration sites

Stage 3 - testing soils

Stage 4 - 3 days of workshops for the community

Stage 5 - evaluation of work and -

The main project was the soil carbon farming project. Three farms have demonstration sites and there has been a soil pit demonstration day as well as a workshop at Ruffy.

Facilitator funding, Bio Security funding and Regen Agriculture funding has been sought.

What's Next?

Planning is now underway for the next 2 to 3 years

HCCC conducted a survey of our members in 2018 to develop a plan for action, we asked you what was important & what we should focus on. We are planning a new survey based on the outcomes of the last one to further fine tune are actions for the next 2 years.

In the next survey we are looking for project ideas and what is important to our members.

The top 10 things you said were important in the last survey

- 1. Protecting rivers, creeks, bogs, and wetlands
- 2. Protecting remnant vegetation
- 3. Adaptation to climate change
- **4.** Need for financial support for projects & Landcare staff
- 5. Establishing new tree plantings
- 6. Maintaining pest animal, and weed management
- 7. Soil health decline and pasture deterioration
- 8. Protecting paddock trees and growing new ones
- 9. The need for education and technical support
- 10. Establishing native shelterbelts

Currently we are funded to tackle 5 of the top ten issues, these are highlighted in bold.

In next week's TGN the ways of tackling these 5 issues will be expanded upon and the Next Phase presented.








It's the Friday Trifecta!!

"would raise the temperature of the Earth's surface by 4 degrees Celsius" This is impressively close to current predictions.

However, Arrhenius missed the mark when he predicted it would take humanity 3,000 years to increase atmospheric carbon dioxide levels by 50%.

In the 120+ years since 1900 Earth's carbon dioxide levels have already been raised by 40%!



A Time for Reflection as ANZAC Day draws near

Three ANZAC soldiers, from the Strathbogie Shire were awarded the Victoria Cross in honour of their bravery and daring on the battlefield in both the Boer War and WWI. Sadly all 3 were casualties of war but their deeds are recognised at a memorial in Euroa, and by some local geographical features.

Lieutenant Leslie Cecil Maygar VC, DSO, VD (1868-1917)

Les Maygar earned his Victoria Cross in the Boer War and was one of only 6 Australians to do so. According to the Euroa Advertiser it was, "...for especial gallantry. The action for which Lt Maygar receives the cross 'For Valour' was performed in a fight at Grelhoutboom. One of his men was left dishorsed on an open plain, under heavy Boer fire and Lt Maygar, dismounting, placed the man on his horse, himself running the gauntlet of the Boer fire on foot, until he could

reach cover." Apparently it came as no surprise to his fellow comrades or his friends and family that Maygar would put himself into such a perilous situation, such was his devotion to God, King and Country. His mother, residing at Strathearn, Ruffy was particularly proud of his actions and "received numerous congratulations on the honour conferred on her brave son."

When WWI broke out he enlisted and served with the 8th Australian Light Horse Regiment receiving further distinctions, being Mentioned in Dispatches—3 times and attaining the rank of Lieutenant Colonel. Sadly this time he didn't make it home. Aged 49 he died (1/11/1917) waiting in reserve with his regiment and lies in the Beersheba War Cemetery.

Maygar's Hill, just north of Old Longwood, is named in his honour.
