Some interesting points from the last 2 HCCC meetings

Regenerative agriculture – the most important aspect is to REST your paddocks.

Dung beetles are a helpful addition to any paddocks but sadly the different varieties are seasonal. A South Australian Company - Dung Beetle Ecosystem Engineers is aiming is to establish dung beetles that will operate throughout the year. Stay tuned for developments from Janet.

Neil attended a 2 day course about rabbits, and discovered that there is still "A lot to learn!". A new strain of calici-mystery source is circulating. Rabbits are a big problem with no foreseeable solution. Volunteers are required to help monitor numbers and locations. The damp summers and extra growth could lead

to an upsurge in the rabbit population over the next few years.

HCCC will be purchasing some bio-security kits for use on farms during field visits, due to Foot & Mouth now being present in Indonesia.

Keep an eye out for Watsonia Lily and Bridal Veil Creeper - both are invasive weeds and, where possible, need to be eradicated before they become established and almost impossible to remove.

Finally, as a Landcare group, the HCCC and this newsletter will be taking a neutral position in any discussion on the proposed windfarm, featured in recent issues. Moderated letters to TGN on this topic, are welcome however only factual, informative and



instructive content will be published in an effort to better inform our local communities. If specific environmental issues arise then these will also be covered in this publication. Thank you for your understanding in this matter.

Letter to the Editor

In response to Stuart Reid, there is another illness / disease which is written about and I first saw it referenced in The Guardian in 2016 (see below). It's called 'Affluenza'. 'Affluenza' is the psychological dysfunction caused by the obsessive and competitive pursuit for more - more money, more material items, more power.

Symptoms of Affluenza include a myopic focus on work and earning money, strained personal relationships, depression, a self-image tied directly to financial status and difficulty interacting with or relating to others.

"De Graaf is a co-author of **Affluenza: How Overconsumption Is Killing Us – and How to Fight Back,** first published in 2001 and updated for a third edition in 2014. That book defines the term as "a painful, contagious, socially transmitted condition of overload, debt, anxiety, and waste resulting from the dogged pursuit of more".

British psychologist Oliver James, in his 2007 book **Affluenza: How to be Successful and Stay Sane**, argues that the entire world is experiencing an epidemic of affluenza (He defines it as a burning envy & obsessive desire to keep up with the Joneses that can lead to severe depression and anxiety).

This not a new thing and has been traced back to the 1800s, but it gained some prominence in the early 2000s.

The word **affluenza** has been mentioned as far back as the 1800s, according to an analysis by Google Books, tracing mentions of the word over time. Its coinage has most widely been attributed to Fred Whitman, a descendant of a prominent and wealthy San Francisco family, who purportedly came up with the idea for the combination of words in 1954 as he was "looking into the problems of inherited money", according to The Chicago Tribune.

But **affluenza** was referenced even earlier, in 1908, by a columnist writing for a London newspaper. In the article, the columnist credits William John Locke, author of The Beloved Vagabond, a novel about an architect in 19th century France who decides to disguise himself as a tramp, with coining the term in the 1906 book.

At the end of 2018 there were 3.5 million people seeking asylum in various countries and 25.9 million refugees.

Of those 25.9 million refugees 50% of them were children under 18 years old.

This does not include more recent refugees who are fleeing the rise of the Taliban, again, in Afghanistan or the displacement of millions of Ukrainians during the last 4 months of conflict.

Nor does it include the environmental refugees whose homes and countries are becoming uninhabitable as a result of Global Warming.


