# Post Covid - Post Carbon

#### Did you know?

Following on from last week and Fourier's theories in 1824 other 19thC scientists also started to investigate the gases that are part of our Earth's atmosphere.

**In 1856**, Eunice Newton Foote, an American scientist, inventor and women's rights campaigner devised an experiment to identify which gases could force the atmosphere to heat up. She discovered that hydrogen heated up the least while carbon dioxide became the hottest. She also made the prediction that "an atmosphere of that gas (carbon dioxide) would give to our Earth a higher temperature."

The course will be delivered by local and national leaders in tree growing on farms. ### Our very best friends...

Some readers may be currently enjoying watching 'Muster Dogs' on ABC TV at 7.30 on Sunday nights. This happy documentary follows the training of 5 exuberant kelpie puppies in various locations around Australia. Bred in Western Victoria the premise is to see if the stock dogs' training can be condensed into 12 months rather than the usual 3 years. All the puppies are seriously cute but definitely bred to work and as one of the farmers from Qld, Frank Finger, so eloquently put it - "You feel like you've forgotten to get dressed if you go out into the paddock without a dog." And as the RSPCA article below indicates a dog is never 'fully dressed' without a tail.

# WHY ARE TAILS SO IMPORTANT? RSPCA

RSPCA was instrumental in making cosmetic tail docking illegal across Australia nearly 15 years ago, but you may wonder why we spent so long lobbying against this cruel practice. While the pain, however severe, may be temporary – <u>docked tails affect dogs</u> for the rest of their lives.

Dogs have evolved to form large social groups with humans and they rely heavily on non-verbal communication. Dogs use their tails, ears, eyes, body position and facial expressions to let us know how they're feeling.

A tail's position can let you, and other dogs, know if a dog is agitated, happy or scared.

### A RELAXED, FRIENDLY DOG MAY ...

- 🕫 Wag their tail (broad strokes with a wiggly burn)
- Have a loose body
- P Do a play bow
- Have relaxed ears
- 😤 Be lying down, restful

# A STRESSED OR WORRIED DOG MAY SHOW ...

- 🕫 Rigid body, ears up, alert
- 🖏 Licking lips
- Panting (when not hot or thirsty often confused with smiling)
- Yawning (when not tired)
- Hypervigilance (looking around constantly)
- 🍄 Tail lifted high

### A FEARFUL DOG MAY SHOW ...

- Body lowered to the ground, cowering
- 🕫 Ears back or to the side
- C Minimal or no eye contact
- TAttempts to move away

Stressed or fearful dogs may resort to aggression if they feel there's no other option. If it's safe to do so, remove them from the situation in a careful manner.

While some breeds are born with shorter tails, dogs like Bosley whose tails are illegally docked for cosmetic reasons, will sadly always be at a disadvantage.
