#### Welcome, Wumindjika & G'day

September not only heralds the arrival of spring but is also National Biodiversity month and included in its 30 days, on September 7th, is National Threatened Species Day which makes for an interesting

combination of environmental issues.

It has been mentioned previously in this informative epistle that the 7th Sept. was chosen for National Threatened Species Day as that was the day, in 1936, when the last known surviving Thylacine (Tasmanian Tiger) died in captivity in a Hobart Zoo.

86 years on from that species' extinction event one could ask the question - Have we learnt from our mistakes? and the answer is definitely no..

Whilst regenerative farming is certainly heightening people's awareness of a better way to do things, for all living creatures, the attrition rate of living organisms in Australia, mammals in particular, is nothing to be proud of.

Australia has one of the most diverse collections of plants and animals in the world and our continent is home to more than 1 million plants and animals, many unique to our wide, brown land. However since 1788 we have had a steady rate of extinction of approx. 4 species per decade.

Our extinction of mammals is appalling - since 1500 - 35% of all global mammal extinctions have been Australian, that's 30 out of 84 extinctions worldwide. Sadly feral predators have been implicated in 28 of these extinctions and of the 273 Australian endemic land mammal species, 11% are extinct!

The International Union for Conservation of Nature and Natural Resources (IUCN) maintains a Red List of not only extinct species but endangered and threatened species too. Australia comes in at #5 on the extinction list but also features in the Top 10 for endangered and threatened species with 909 species currently listed as critically endangered, endangered and vulnerable!

Two of these critically endangered species - the Greater Glider and, Victoria's faunal emblem the Leadbeater's Possum - live just south of the HCCC area in the Tallarook and Toolangi State Forests. Forests that are either being logged or tagged to be! Mammal extinctions 31 & 32 are preventable - we just need to value and protect both them & their habitat. Read on for another great issue... 

### The GREAT Australian Platypus Survey

The Great Australian Platypus Survey results have been announced eDNA Samples were collected in November 2021

Hughes Creek at Dropmore - Positive platypus detected
County Creek at Tarcombe - Possible platypus detection
Whiteheads Creek at Seymour - Possible platypus detection.
Discovery Creek at Wicket Hill Road - No platypus detected

Thanks to this research, ecologists were able to deduce that platypuses remain widely distributed throughout Victoria, with more extensive populations in the eastern regions compared to the drier and more modified northern and western areas of the state, where populations appear much more restricted and fragmented.

Clare Watson and Janet Hagen from Landcare collected the Hughes Creek samples, linking us to one of the world's biggest citizen science projects! With their help the project was able to collect close to 2,000 eDNA samples from waterways all over Victoria and develop never before seen spatial data on Victoria's platypus population.


