Read on for another great issue... **Pauline**And Kenny Koala...was keeping the turkeys for sale, company.






Thanks to John & Lisa we have prizes....



HIGHLANDS-CAVEAT CFA TRAINING AND PRE-SEASON MEETING

An excellent pre-season training session was held yesterday at the Highlands CFA shed & included a timely reminder for ALL local residents and landholders of the following tasks for Bushfire Season preparation.

- 1. Spray and mow regularly
- 2. Create mineral earth fire breaks (Bare earth, don't just plough the fuel in)
- 3. Clean up rubbish, remove dead wood (any fuel). Lift the canopy off the ground
- 4. Re-visit or make your Fire Action Plan
- 5. Check safety bag contents appropriate clothing, batteries, gloves, water
- 6. Ensure emergency contacts are visible and accurate
- 7. Check and service fire-fighting equipment
- 8. Ensure water supplies are as good as possible Gravity supply if possible or have an alternative pump
- 9. Buy extra batteries, mops, etc
- 10. If power goes off, can you operate pumps, landline, remote controlled doors or gates?
- 11. Property access, you may be able to drive under a tree in a car VUT can a fire truck turn around?
- 12. If your plan is to leave early, what are you taking with you?

Freedom of Religion and Football?

Following the Essendon Football Club controversy, there were no surprises when religious leaders come out and played the 'religious freedom' card. When that happens, nothing really changes. I favour freedom of religion, but I do wonder whether churches and religious groups ever seriously reflect on why some of their doctrines and restrictions give offence to so many. When will they critically and theologically examine their doctrines in the light of the current human condition? Some churches have courageously done just that and retained their integrity. Many, including some mainstream churches are simply stuck in concrete. Their response will inevitably be that the Bible is their source of authority.

It is true that if you are selective of verses, you can get the Bible to say almost anything. For instance, there are those who use the Bible to validate their racism, homophobia and patriarchy. Others rationalise serious exploitation of the environment, the accumulation of wealth, and some even use it to develop conspiracy theories about the end of the world.

I believe this is a misuse of the Bible, which needs to be read wholistically. Selecting texts out of context and without wider reference narrows meaning and ignores the profound spirituality of the Bible.

When we are faced with the freedom of religion argument, it does seem that many of us are being asked to be tolerant of the views of religious groups even though we regard them as offensive to human dignity, while on the other hand the religious establishment can remain quite intolerant. One of the major themes of the Hebrew Scriptures is 'justice', in the New Testament the overwhelming theme is 'profound 'love'. When the religious freedom card is played love and justice seem to be absent.

Did you know that we share our home with some very special animals?

Learn more about why your contributions are important to help understand what is living around us.

At a time where many areas in south eastern Australia have been impacted by bushfires, expanding developments and changing climate, our local environment is an important refuge for a range of iconic species such as the quirky Gang Gang cockatoo. This wonderful bird visits us each summer and autumn to feast on a range of seeds, ranging from Hawthorn berries, Wattles and Eucalypts. Sadly, this species is now classified as Endangered on the national threatened species list following the Black Summer fires impacting much of their habitat in NSW. Join us to learn how to map our local native biodiversity sightings to monitor and record their presence.

There's a number of mapping tools that record species distribution to help a range of organisations and environmental managers to better understand which native plants and animals live where. Our contributions are particularly important to understand the role of habitat on private property, where formal surveys are rarely undertaken.

This session will help you head out and record the many cool plants and animals that visit your home.
