In the space of the last couple of days the HCCC area has moved on from wet and soggy to inundated with both the threat and reality of floods in multiple locations. To those readers who are affected by any of the following waterways - Goulburn River, Hughes Creek, Seven Creeks and Castle Creek - to name a few of the bigger inundations - I hope that you are all safe and well and that Friday's deluge and resultant flooding is the worst you have to experience and that its impact was minimal.

Although not an official weather site the rain gauge on the Roberts' front deck recorded 135mm of rain between 12.01am Wednesday through to 8pm Saturday (68 hours) which is huge and the view from that same front deck has morphed from a total white in on Thursday to seeing "Lake Goulburn" spread extensively over the river flats just north of Yea in the last few days. The transformation was incredibly quick and appears to be in no hurry to dissipate at present.

Needless to say, both the rain and the flooding have meant that several events have been postponed in recent days, see inside for more details, including last week's HCCC meeting which is now being held tomorrow evening Monday 17th Oct. @ 7.30pm @ Highlands Hall.
