Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot Round 2 Webinar

Some landholders may want some more information on the Carbon + Biodiversity project... Webinar on next Tuesday.

Applications are currently open for round 2 of the Australian Government's Carbon + Biodiversity Pilot!

Are you interested in how the Pilot will work? On **Tuesday 15 February at 1 pm (AEDT),** the Australian Government will host a webinar to discuss all you need to know. Attend the webinar to have your questions answered before **round 2 applications close on Thursday 3**March.

The Pilot is a key part of the Australian Government's \$66.1 million Agriculture Biodiversity

Stewardship Package and will reward farmers for the stewardship of their land, storing carbon and improving Australia's biodiversity.

Round 2 builds on the success and learnings of round 1 to further test market arrangements to reward farmers for their biodiversity stewardship in 6 new regions:

- Fitzroy Basin in Queensland
- · Riverina in New South Wales
- · Goulburn Broken in Victoria
- Southern in Tasmania
- · Northern and Yorke in South Australia
- South Coast in Western Australia.

Farmers who plant native trees and shrubs, in line with a biodiversity protocol developed by the Australian National University, can receive payments for biodiversity in addition to any earnings from selling the carbon credits.



The webinar will see panellists present from the Department of Agriculture, Water and the Environment, Australian National University, Clean Energy Regulator and Fitzroy Basin Association.

LATEST COVID REQUIREMENTS for CFA Volunteers



On Thursday evening 10/2/22 Victoria's Chief Health Officer issued updated timelines for receiving the COVID-19 booster, which is mandatory for CFA staff and volunteers under the Victorian Pandemic Orders.

Under the Orders workers in emergency services who are already required to be fully vaccinated, must get their third dose or have a medical exemption to work outside of the home.

The updated timeframes provide an additional four weeks for people to receive their booster provided they can provide proof of appointment. Find out more about booking your appointment.

The new timeframes for this requirement to be met depend on when you received your second dose.

If you became fully vaccinated on or before
12 September 2021, the deadline is
now
12 March 2022.

If you became fully vaccinated after 12 September
2021, the deadline is how 29 March 2022.

Temporary medical exemptions for those who have previously tested positive to COVID-19 are only provided for up to four months and MUST have the approval of a GP. View more information



- * Urinary changes such as frequency or urgency
- * Appetite loss, feeling full quickly or indigestion

Having a family history of breast or ovarian cancer may mean that you are at a higher risk of developing OC.
